Schedule B: <u>Standards of Practice</u>

Standard 3: Continuing Competency (Approved Sept 17, 2008)

1) <u>The Requirement:</u>

- a) 20 hours of Continuing Professional Development (CPD) activity every twoyear cycle.
- b) One CPD Point equals one hour of activity.
- c) The two-year cycle runs from January 1st 2007 to December 31st 2008 and so on.

2) <u>Ten areas of clinical practice, which are considered essential for CPD, the 'core topics' are:</u>

Core Topics:

- a. Vascular assessment
- b. Neurological assessment
- **c**. Wound healing
- d. The diabetic foot
- e. The rheumatoid foot

- f. Local analgesia
- g. Pharmacology
- h. Podiatric surgery
- i. Biomechanics
- j. Infection control.

It is recommended that a course on three of the core topics be completed every year. Over a three-year cycle, each course should therefore have been attended at least once.

3) In addition, it is mandatory that an update be achieved in:

- i. Basic Life Support (CPR) every year, and
- ii. First Aid once every 3 years, commencing January 2007.
- a) Evidence of successful completion of a course of instruction must be provided to the CPD Officer before annual renewal of membership.
 - b) In addition to the core topics, members will be expected to engage in general professional development each year.

5) Achieving CPD Points:

CPD Points can be achieved by either:

- a) Attending Activities, or
- b) Independent Learning.
- a) <u>Attending Activities</u> at least 50% of the required CPD Points for each cycle must be credited to attending activities:
 - i. Scientific sessions of international, national and provincial podiatric conventions.
 - ii. University courses, lectures, seminars and scientific meetings relevant to podiatric practice or research.
 - iii. Short-term residencies.
 - iv. Formal ward rounds, grand rounds, etc.
- b) <u>Independent Learning</u> up to 50% of the required CPD Points for each cycle may be credited to independent learning. Under this section credit may be claimed for learning carried out privately, including:
 - i. Watching video tapes /DVDs.
 - ii. Online CPD, completing self-assessment questions where available.
 - iii. Teaching and preceptorship, e.g. includes that to health professions.
 - iv. Attending a journal club (this may be online)
 - v. Publication of case studies; research and/or audit;
 - vi. Time spent in preparation for examination for speciality or other formal higher education activities Programs which have met Continuing Medical Education (CME) requirements, or recertification by a certifying body, association, college, etc., which is accepted by this College for that purpose.
 - vii. Clinical supervision, mentoring or reflective practice and health education lecturing;
 - viii. Representation on health or work related committee(s).

6) <u>Pre-approval by the CPD Officer:</u>

- a) Other than Podiatry Conferences, all CPD credits, either Attending Activities or Independent Learning, must be pre-approved by the CPD Officer for eligibility.
- b) Proof of attendance must accompany the portfolio; proof of payment of fee is <u>not</u> sufficient.
